

The Anglican Pilgrimage A Conference for Seminarians and Clergy in the Early Years of their Ordained Ministry

**FRIDAY 11-
FRIDAY 25 JUNE 2010**

Every summer Canterbury Cathedral invites ordinands and newly ordained clergy from around the Anglican Communion to share their lives together, praying, studying and exchanging experiences and ideas.

Guided by an international faculty, students live in the International Study Centre at Canterbury. They join the Cathedral community's daily life which is centred on daily worship. This is an opportunity to explore aspects of our journey with Christ together, particularly in the different cultural contexts in which we minister.

Sponsored by Canterbury Cathedral the conference has three pillars:

- ◆ Academic work
- ◆ Participation in the Cathedral's life and worship
- ◆ Living together in community.

Students come from all over the Anglican Communion and have an intensive community experience during their time in Canterbury. This will be the ninth presentation; in that time we have welcomed guests from over 50 countries. The aim of the conference is to broaden horizons by exploring the strength of Anglicanism in practising Communion in a diversity of cultures. Full course credit is available for this programme for those who wish to obtain it. The Canterbury summer conference is designed for ordinands and those priests who are in the early years of their ordained ministry. It is intended as an investment in the future of the Anglican Communion, and those who come are those who will make a contribution in the years ahead.

One day will be spent in visiting the offices of the Anglican Communion. There will also be an opportunity to explore different aspects of the life and work of Canterbury Cathedral as well as going on a walk along the ancient Pilgrims' Way which leads to Canterbury.

Application and payment

The fee for the 2010 conference is £1,150. This covers your board, accommodation, tuition and organised outings. **Air fares are not included.** Bursaries are available for some applicants. Your application should be received at the Cathedral offices by **28 February 2010** together with your deposit payment of £600. The residual balance should be paid by **15 May 2010.**

- ◆ A statement of your chosen ministerial path, explaining how you feel you would benefit from the conference
- ◆ (For ordained clergy) A copy of your certificate of ordination
